

Australian Pony Stud Book Society

Part Bred Regulations

1. General

- a) Until otherwise determined by the Council, the following Regulations shall be the Part-Bred Regulations of the Society governing the recording of Part-Bred ponies in the Society's Part-Bred Register.
- b) In these Regulations, "the Society" and "APSB" mean the Australian Pony Stud Book Society and "recognised society" means a recognised society as defined in the Society's Stud Book Regulations.

2. The Part-Bred Register – MARE & GELDINGS

- a) The Society's Part-Bred Register is open to any mare or gelding for which it can be proven that it has at least 25 percent Society registered, pure-bred bloodlines, within two generations, calculated from the sire or the dam, [not both] whose breeding can be proven to be eligible by production of a service certificate or a registration certificate from a recognised society.
- b) To be accepted for part-bred registration with the Society, a pony is to be ineligible for registration in any of the pure-bred sections.
- c) Part-Bred ponies are to be branded on the near shoulder with an identifying brand. Off shoulder brands, indicating foal number and foaling year are optional. A Microchip will be accepted for identification if registered with another society as micro chipped only otherwise branding is required. The microchip number will be recorded on the certificate. If branding is applicable, off shoulder brands will be mandatory on all colts born after the 1st August 2012.
- d) There is no age limit for part-bred registration.
- e) There is no height limit for part-bred registration.
- f) Once registered with the Society, part-bred ponies are not eligible for transfer to any of the pure-bred sections of the Society's stud book.
- g) Applications for registration shall only be accepted on the prescribed form and from the registered owner, who is to be a current member of the Society.
- h) Part-bred ponies shall be allocated the suffix "PB" to their registered number.

3. APSB Part Bred Stallions /Colts.

- a) Stallions and colts must have 50% APSB bloodlines from either sire or dam. (Not cumulative from both)
- b) Parent must be registered in their appropriate section of the APSB Society Stud Book and in the case of the APSB parent being a mare, proof of ownership of the mare is required.
- c) An application for a stallion or colt with sire or dam listed as 'unknown' will not be accepted.

- d) **The only acceptable crosses will be Australian, Welsh (All Sections) and Connemara.**
- e) In the event of crossbreeding (example Shetland x Australian) the following crosses will **not** be accepted as stallion/colt. Hackney, Shetland, Highland, New Forest, Dartmoor, Fjord, Fell.
- f) Colts and Stallions born before August 1st, 2012 will be accepted with proof of breeding, either a service certificate or a registration certificate from a recognised breed society, showing breeding and the name of current owner.
- g) Colts and Stallion born from 1st August 2012 the mating must be entered on a mare or stallion return. If the breeder is not the owner of the stallion, or the stallion is registered with another breed society a service certificate is required.
- h) Regulations as the registration of purebred foals will apply.
Part Bred stallions and colts are to be recorded with their breeder's prefix and brand, in accordance with APSBS regulations. A Microchip will be accepted for identification if registered with another society as micro chipped only otherwise branding is required. *The microchip number will be recorded on the certificate. Proof of identity in the event of showing or sale will be the responsibility of the owner. Should there be a discrepancy then DNA will be required.*
- i] If branding is applicable, off shoulder brands will be mandatory on all colts born after the 1st August 2012.
- j] All current fees and regulations for the registration of pure bred stallions will apply to the recording of Part bred Stallions.

4. The Society's Part bred register is NOT OPEN to:

- a) A Stallion/Colt eligible for registration in any of the purebred sections of the Stud Book.
- b) A Stallion/Colt registered with a recognised Society and is eligible for reciprocal rights registration with the Society.
- c) A Stallion/Colt which has been foal recorded in the purebred section of the Society's Stud Book and is liable for penalty fees on the late adult registration is **NOT** eligible for Part Bred Recording.

5. Showing:

- A Stallion/Colt/Mare /Filly or Gelding registered in the society's Part Bred register can only be shown in the APSB Part bred classes by the registered owner, who is to be a current member of the Society.
